An adverb is a word that limits  
or modifies (i.e. tells more  
about) the meaning of any  
part of speech except a noun  
or pronoun.

When the subject of the sentence  
is having something done to him  
or her, or it, the verb is said to be  
in the passive voice. E.g. The ball  
was kicked by the boy.

Fairly, very, reasonably,  
almost, quite, too.

Slowly, quickly, angrily, calmly,  
badly.

Here, there, inside, outside,  
above, below, between.

A preposition is a word that  
shows the relationship between  
one noun and another noun or  
pronoun in a sentence. E.g. on,  
by, to, in, down, out, round

Certainly, surely, tentatively,  
perhaps, not.

Once, twice, firstly, secondly,  
finally, again.
