These join a dependant clause to a main clause e.g. because, although.

These join two or more main clauses e.g. and, but.

A conjunction is a word used to join single words, phrases, or sentences.

A—is used when any one of a group of objects, not some particular one, will do.

The—is used to refer to some specific person or thing or event on which attention is being focussed.

The article is a kind of determiner.

A group of words centred around an adjective. E.g. The final exams were **unbelievably difficult.**

A group of words centred around a noun. E.g. I've met **the last remaining contestant.**

A group of words that adds information to a sentence.
